SHOW REGULATIONS

1) Eligibility of Competitors.

Entries to the Village Show are restricted to all those who live or go to school or church or have close family in Swavesey. To make a good show, residents are encouraged to enter exhibits whether they expect to reach winning standard or not.

In other words, have a go!

2) Entries

- Entries must be made on the official Entry Form and delivered to Mrs Sally Unwin, 6, Taylors Lane, Swavesey.
- All entries must have been produced by the exhibitor.
- Entry fee: Adults 35p per class or 3 entries for £1,
- Children 15p per class or 4 entries for 50p.
- Late entries will not be accepted.

3) On the day

- Exhibits may be brought to the show from 8.30am on the day and must be ready and in place for the judges by 10.30am.
- Each exhibitor will be allocated a number to be displayed on each exhibit. Only the names of prize winners will be divulged.
- All exhibitors must supply their own plates, trays, dishes, bowls, baskets, vases and display labels.
- All flowers should be brought to the marquee to be arranged.
- All vegetables exhibited must be clean and free from soil and the tops trimmed to 8cms.
- In the event of a tie for the highest number of points in a section the first prize for that section will be awarded to the entrant with the highest number of first prizes. If still tied, the judge will indicate the best exhibit as the deciding factor.
- No entries to be moved before 5pm.

4) Judging

- All persons, except the appointed Stewards, must leave the marquee during judging, unless their presence is required in an official capacity.
- Any class, to be judged, must have a minimum of three entries.
- The judges may withhold awards when exhibits are considered by them to be unworthy of a place.
- The judges' decision shall be final.

5) The Show Subcommittee

- Whilst every reasonable care will be taken the show sub-committee will not be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits.
- All disputes will be resolved by the show subcommittee whose decision will be final.

6) Prizes

- A prize card and rosette will be awarded to the winner of each class, and a prize card to the second and third placed entrant.

7) Special Awards

- The competitor with the most points in any one section will be given a special award. For multiple entries in any section then the highest scoring point will be taken

SHOW SCHEDULE

Section 1 FLOWERS AND POT PLANTS

- 1) One specimen rose
- 2) One stem any cluster rose
- 3) Three stems any flowering herbaceous perennials under 30cms
- 4) Three stems any flowering herbaceous perennials 30cms and over.
- 5) Five stems any annuals (medley)
- 6) Potted garden plant/s under 30cm diameter pot
- 7) Five stems any pansies or violas
- 8) Five stems any sweet peas
- 9) Pot of cacti or succulents not over 1m in dimension including pot.
- 10) Five stems ornamental grass
- 11) Pot of flowering bulbs/corms/tubers
- 12) Five stems any dianthus (pinks)
- 13) Three Hosta leaves, any variety (varieties)



Section 2 FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

- 14) Plate of ten strawberries
- 15) Plate of ten gooseberries
- 16) Plate of 20 raspberries
- 17) Two stalks of currants (black or red)
- 18) Five carrots
- 19) Five pods of broad beans
- 20) Five shallots
- 21) Three courgettes

- 22) Nine pods of peas
- 23) Selection of three vegetables
- 24) Selection of six vegetables
- 25) Two lettuces - any variety
- 26) Nine green salad onions
- 27) One head of spring cabbage
- 28) Funniest or most mis-shapen vegetable

Section 3 JUNIOR SECTION

All entries must be the unaided work of the exhibitor. Younger children can enter older or adult classes.

5 YEARS AND UNDER

- 29) Collage on A4 card using recycled materials
- 30) Three decorated cup cakes - to be judged on decoration only
- 31) Jam jar of wild flowers
- 32) An edible necklace

6-11 YEARS

- 33) Paint a picture of yourself
- 34) Make six cup cakes
- 35) Miniature garden in a seed tray/plate (max size 40cmx 25cm)
- 36) Make a desk tidy (max base 10cmx15cm) made from waste materials. May be painted or covered.
- 37) Decorated egg

12 - 16 YEARS

- 38) A photograph taken by yourself (15cmx10cm)
- 39) A computer generated greetings card (15x21cm)
- 40) A drawing in any medium

Section 4 FLORAL ART

- 41) Arrangement of Flowers, maximum: 60cms, with accessories.
Theme: Something old, something new
- 42) Arrangement in a recycled container
- 43) Table decoration with flowers and foliage from your own garden
(maximum: 30cm long x 20cm wide)
- 44) Men only - arrangement in a mug
- 45) A green (in colour) arrangement - max 60cm



Section 5 COOKERY

- 46) One jar of jam or marmalade
- 47) Four bread rolls
- 48) One Victoria sandwich (see recipe given)
- 49) Four cheese scones
- 50) One boiled fruit cake (see recipe given)
- 51) Four chocolate chip cookies

GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITORS

- 1) All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor
- 2) All vegetables, fruit and flower classes (other than floral art Classes) must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- 3) Exhibits should not have been presented in the previous Swavesey Festival Village Show.

RECIPE FOR CLASS 47 - VICTORIA SANDWICH

Two 18cm (7inch) sandwich tins, Oven 190 C, Gas mark 5, cook for about 20 minutes

Ingredients

175g (6 oz) Soft margarine

175g (6 oz) Caster sugar

3 eggs beaten

175g (6 oz) Self raising flour

30ml (2 tbsp) raspberry jam

Caster sugar to dredge

- 1) Grease two 18cm (7inch) sandwich tins and line the base of each with a round of greaseproof paper.
- 2) Beat the margarine and sugar together until light and fluffy. Add the eggs a little at a time, beating well after each addition. Fold in half the flour, using a metal spoon, then fold in the rest.
- 3) Place half the mixture in each tin and level with a knife. Bake in the oven at 190 C (375 F, gas mark 5) for about 20 minutes, until they are well risen, firm to the touch and beginning to shrink away from the sides of the tins. Turn out and cool on a wire rack.
- 4) When the cakes are cool, sandwich them together with jam and sprinkle the top with caster sugar.

RECIPE FOR CLASS 49 - BOILED FRUIT CAKE,

8" Round Tin, Oven 150 C, Gas Mark 2, Cook for 1½ hours.

Ingredients

6oz/170g butter or hard margarine

8oz/225g sugar

8 fluid oz water

12oz/340g mixed dried fruit,

1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda

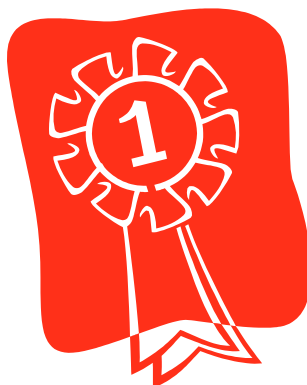
8oz/225g SR flour

1 teaspoon mixed spice

2 medium eggs

Place butter, fruit, sugar, water and bicarbonate of soda into a saucepan; heat to melt together, simmer for 5 minutes, then allow to cool for 30 minutes.

Stir in the remaining ingredients, mixing well together. Place in a greased and lined cake tin and cook for 1½ - 2 hours. Leave in tin for 15 minutes before turning out to cool.
